- 1. Print the basket left and right sheets on 180gsm photo card stock or heavier.
- 2. Re-insert into the printer and print the backing paper on the reverse of each.
- 3. Print the basket top sheet (flaps) on 180gsm or heavier. There is no need to print on the back of this sheet.
- 4. Cut all of the pieces out.





5. Cut the strips on the basket sides as shown.




6. Score along the lines as shown.



7. Your left and right basket sides should now look like this.



8. Turn to the right side and apply double sided tape to the base of the basket as shown. Attach left base on top of right base.



9. Take the strips at the top of one side of the basket and overlap as shown – approx. 2.5cm. Glue/tape together.



10. Attach the middle strips as shown. The top corners meet the end points of the strips above.



11. The bottom strips attach so that the short edges approximately line up with the strip above. The main thing to aim for here is that the sides are joined so they are flat.



12. Attach the triangular sides as shown.



13. Assemble the basket top flaps. Attach the patterned tops to the back of the plain pieces. Score down the join near the plain area.



14. Attach the wrong side of the small tabs to the inside of the basket top.



15. Attach handle strips back to back.



16. Using strong tape or glue, attach handle to each side of the basket.

17. Your basket is now ready to decorate.





Basket is approx. 13.5 cm in width and 16.5 cm from base to top of handle.

18. You may wish to punch holes in the basket flaps and close with a ribbon. To punch the holes, close the lid first. Using a needle, make a hole through both flaps so you know it will be flat when tied with the ribbon. Enlarge the holes you have marked, for easy threading of the ribbon.



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
