

# Cutting & Assembly Instructions



This is a simple multiple layered card with a hinged base. As pictured, the sentiment has been embossed to give it a shiny surface and a little bling has been added. The cutout stars match the back fold of the card so you see straight through. The hinge is on the upper left angled side. The flat bottom of the card makes it easy to display.

White on white cards are so elegant but the name should not limit your creativity. Consider a blue and white combination.

The zip file contains the purchased cutting file format, a photo of completed project and the TOU which can be previewed in the shops policy link.

There are only four pieces in this design. The cutting file includes a small stack version to help determine the layering of the pieces.

Materials used for cup798062\_2228 - White on White #1 - White Christmas Card

- 1 sheet 110 lb index weight or 200 gsm for card base
- 1 sheet 110 lb card stock or 300 gsm for layered embellishments
- Optional – 5 silver gems and 8 pearl beads

The design's cutting files were created using Adobe Illustrator (AI) and saved as an SVG file. The file was then opened in cutting machine software and saved in their preferred file format. The sample card was created using Silhouette studio and Cameo 3.

Precaution – The tree star embellishment will cut nicely with a sharp blade. Take care when removing from the cutting mat since the lines are very delicate.

Cut all pieces. Score and fold the card base so the cut stars match. Dry fit the pieces to evaluate if double cutting some of the layers are necessary. The sentiment in the example was cut twice. They were glued together and then covered with embossing powder. Depending on the card stock used this may need three layers.

Layer the pieces and glue in place. Embellish with optional gems and pearls.
