

Tutorial for my Easel Card Kits

1. Print the main card base onto a cardstock of between 210 and 240gsm. Print the decoupage and topper page plus the greetings onto gloss or matt finish card of a lighter weight. Save the greetings you don't use for another card or something else you make down the line. Print the envelope front and back onto a decoupage paper or something of the weight of around 160gsm matt finish. In this kit you have a backing sheet as an extra and you can use it to print on the back of the base easel card by running it through the printer again on the other side.
2. Score and fold on the base easel card where indicated.
3. Cut out all of the decoupage and you can use as much or as little of it as you wish starting with the larger piece first and going down bit by bit to the smaller one to finish off. You can add the topper to the base card to where it is folded over by using either foam tape or glue. Then you can start adding the decoupage by whichever method you prefer, foam tape or glue.
4. Cut out and score the envelope back and front where indicated and fold. Stick to together with a strong double sided tape or a glue. Each person has their own preference on what method they wish to use.
5. Place the spare stopper onto the stopper on the base card with foam tape or something else and then your card will stand up nicely behind the stopper.
6. Choose which ever greeting you want to use and then place it onto the greeting topper already on the card design.
7. Finally you have been provided with a banner (long and narrow) and you can put this onto the back of the finished card with double sided tape so it is easier for you to write your greeting onto it i.e. Happy Birthday Mum Love
