

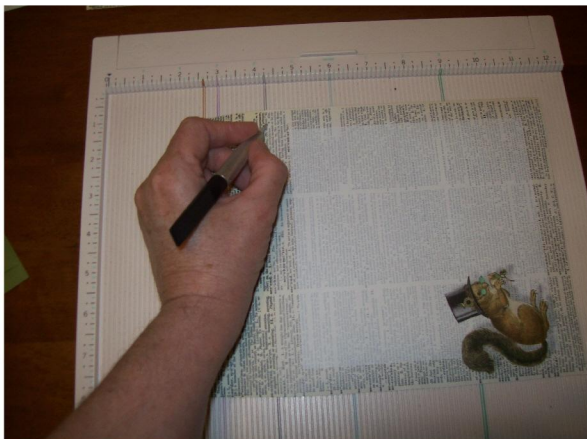
SteamPunk Card with Matching Envelope Tutorial



Gather supplies scissors, score board, double stick tape or glue and the sheets



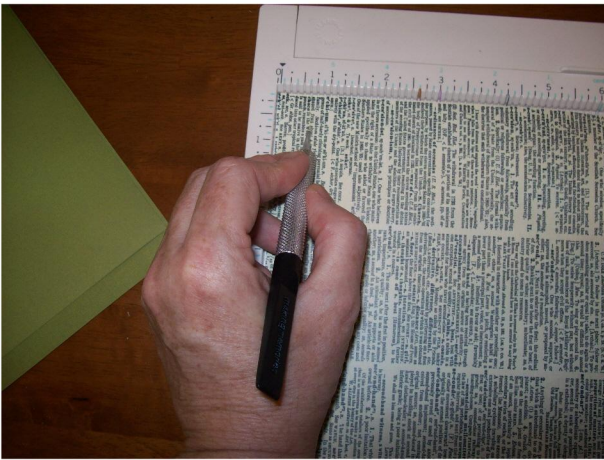
Cut out envelope pieces, and trim around decoupage you will use, set decoupage elements aside. We will start with the envelope. :)



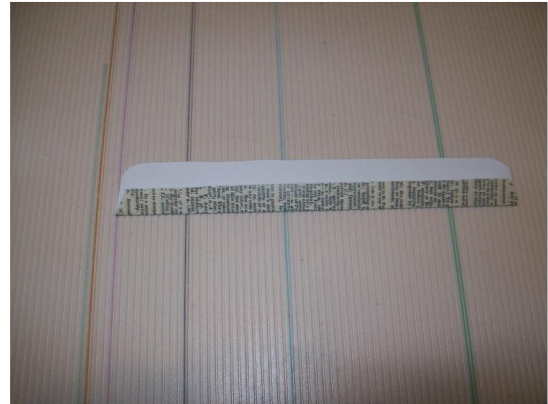
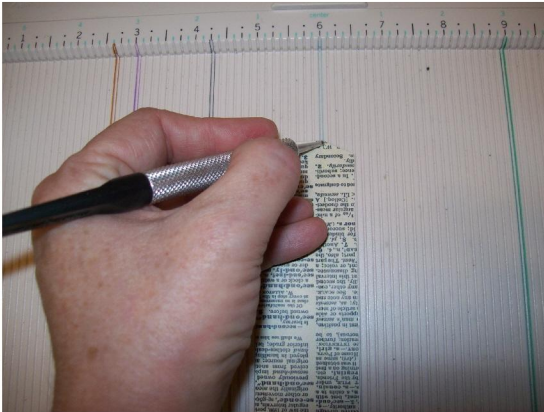
Put the envelope front on the score board. Score at the top of the envelope where the lighter and darker parts meet.



Valley fold and set aside.

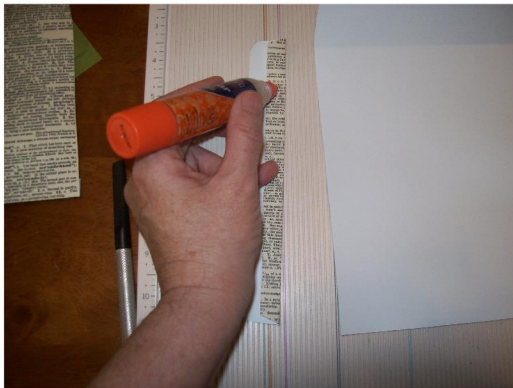


Set the envelope back on the board.
There is a very light dashed line (score).
If you cannot see it, score about 5/8 inch
in from the edge.

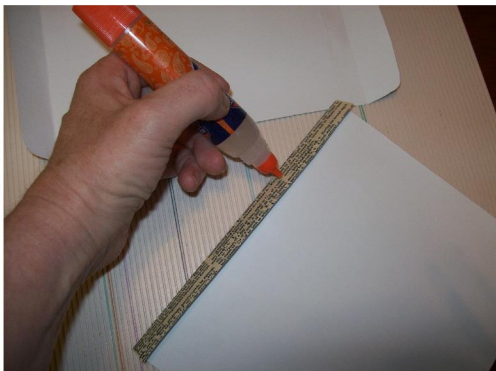


Now you will score each of the side flaps. Score at the tallest point on each flap. Valley fold each one.

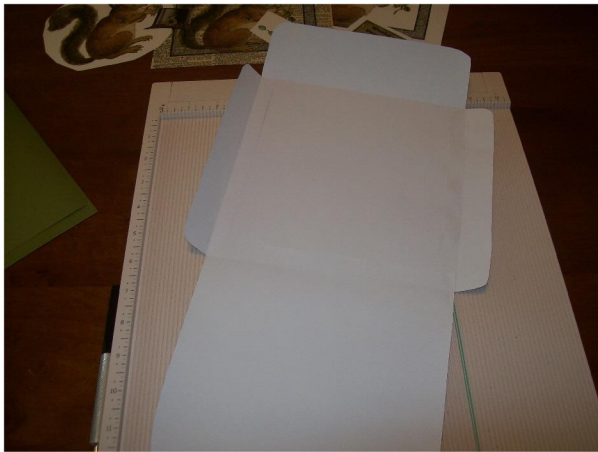
Envelope Assembly:



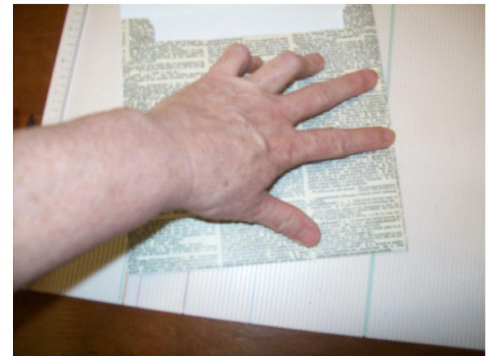
Starting with the left flap, apply glue or ds tape to the edge top to bottom as shown. Attach to the envelope front. Repeat on right side.



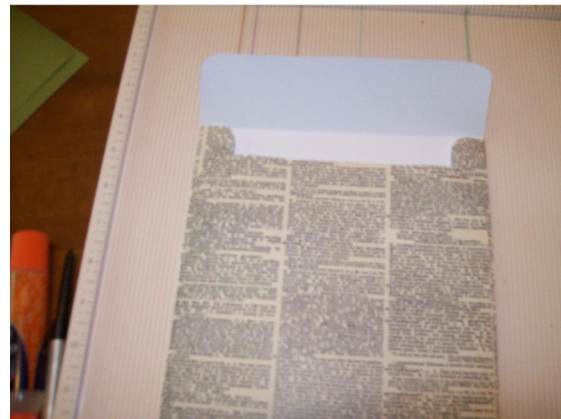
Add glue to the small flap on the bottom portion of the envelope. Line it up on the top portion and press together.



This is what your envelope should look like now.



Almost done! Fold the side flaps in and apply glue to each side flap. Fold up and carefully press each side down into place.



Finished envelope front, and back



For the card you will need two pieces of card stock. Cut to the width of your card, plus 1/4 inch. I made my card 7 1/2 inches to fit nicely into my envelope.



Score one piece about 1/2 inch from the top and fold. Glue the two part together. Where the two pieces are joined will be the inside back of the card.



Fold the card and trim the length to your desired size. Mine is 7 1/2 inches.

Next glue your insert, into your card, this will cover the seam from joining the two pieces of card stock.



Attach the card front to the card blank. Trim all of your decoupage elements, layer your card up, add a sentiment, and it's finished. Stand back and admire your work!!
