
## 3D Window Box Card Instructions

- Print both sheets. I used 180gsm photo card stock. (There is an envelope template available to fit these designs).
- 2. Cut the pieces out.



 Score down the middle of the cover and the other marked lines. The three fold are all mountain folds.



4. Fold the insert in half. This is a valley fold.



5. Attach the greeting and re-fold.



6. Attach the wrong side of the insert to the wrong side of the left of the card.



7. Fold the pop out in half. This is a mountain fold.



8. Score the flaps at each side and fold forwards.



9. Line up the centre folds of the pop out and insert. Attach under flaps of the pop out. NOTE: I recommend attaching the pop out 1mm ABOVE the bottom of the insert. Your card will stand better and you won't have to end up trimming a sliver off the bottom of the pop out like I had to!



10. Attach any decoupage pieces provided on the pop out.



11. Fold into a box shape and attach the remaining side of the "outside" piece to the other half of the insert back.



12. Flatten the box and apply decoupage to the front.

The box easily pops open to stand as a 3D card. There is a space for messages on the back.

Make an envelope to fit as per the instructions on the template sheet.
