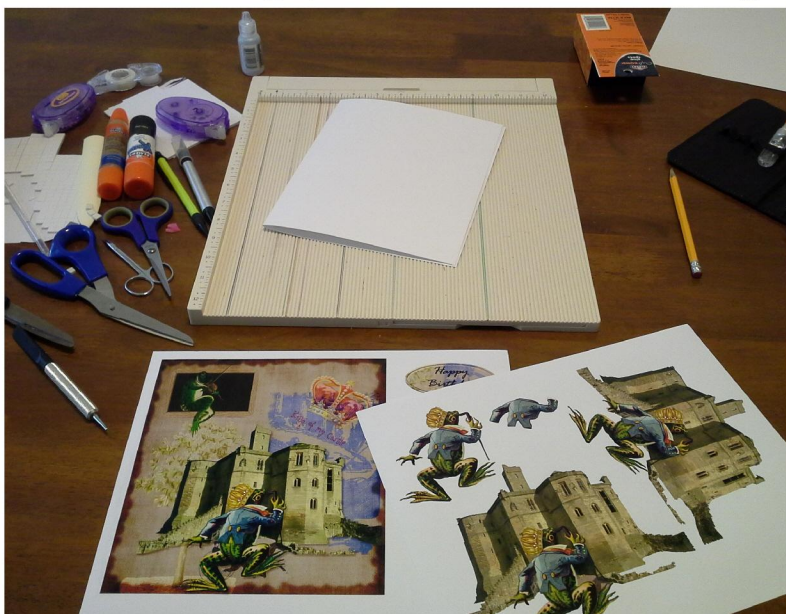


Simply Victorian Decoupage Card Sheets Tutorial



This set of cards was made using my Victorian toppers. For each of the card sheets I used one of the toppers, then added the decoupage elements, to create the card. First print the sheet(s) onto good quality paper. Next gather the tools needed to complete the card. I used a white card blank, scissors, double stick tape runner, double stick foam dots and an exacto knife.



Cut out all of the elements. You can use all of just some of the elements provided. Use the elements to suit your experience level.

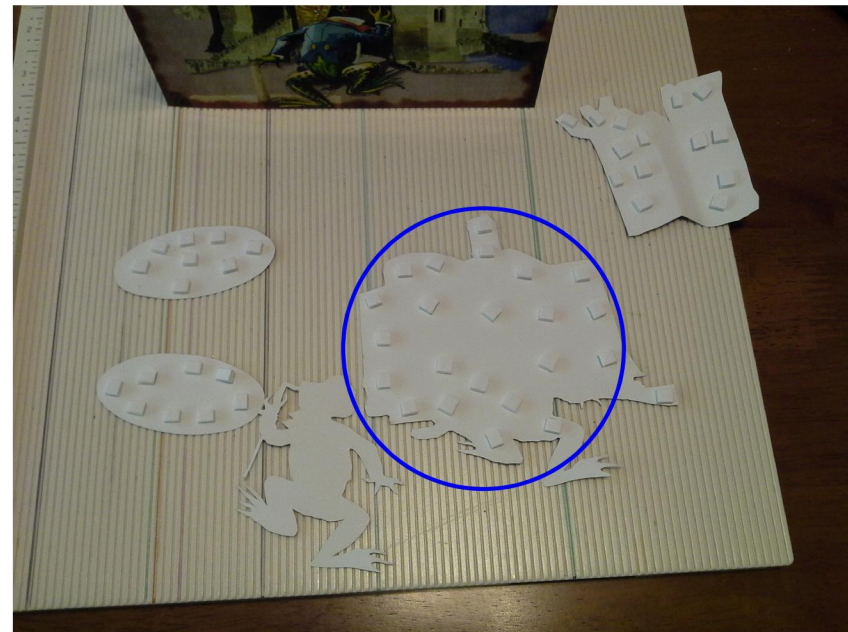


Notice the element with the red circle. I shaped this element to show the dimension of the castle. I also trimmed away the frog's legs and left hand. I did this because I did not want the small pieces of the hand and foot to show below the single frog cut-out on the finished card.



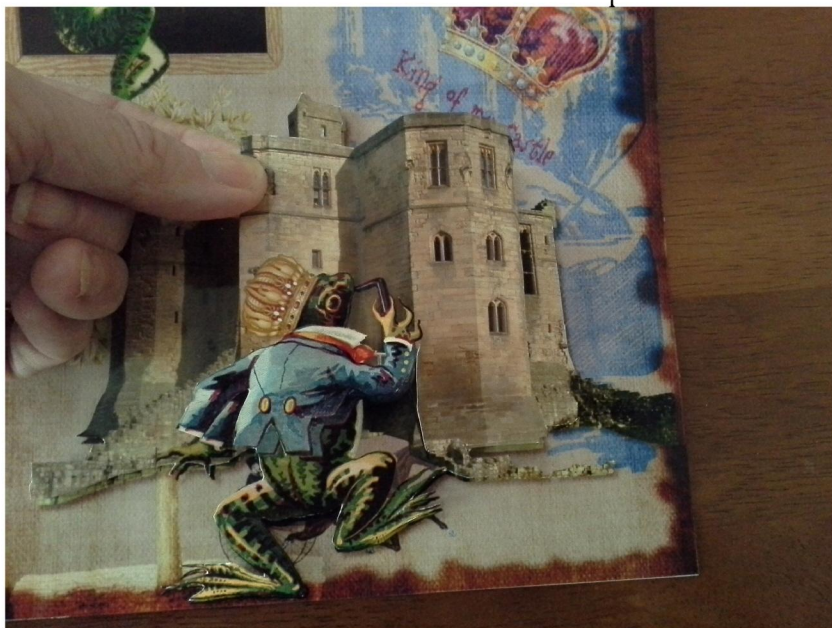

Using your double stick tape runner, glue the topper to your card blank. I then trimmed my card blank to the same size as the topper.

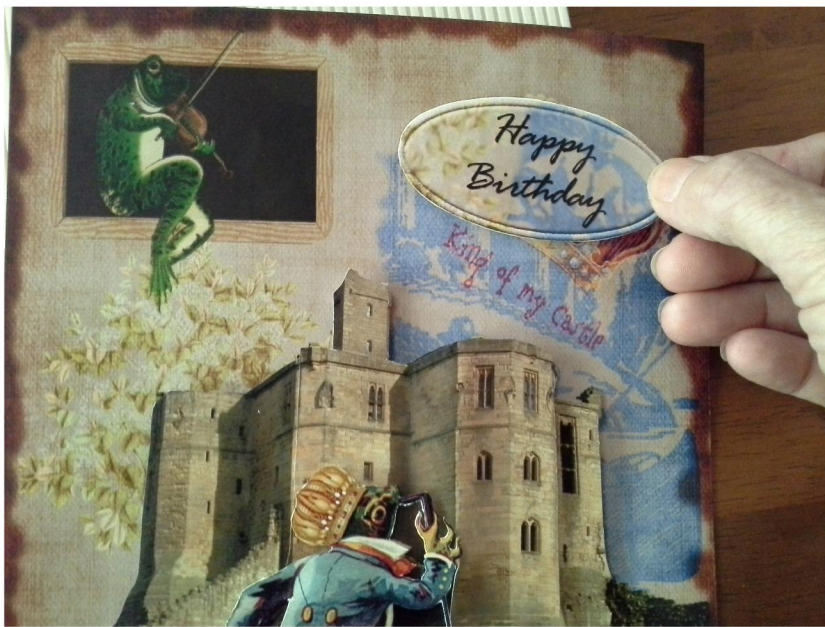
Next turn all of your elements over to the white side. Add your foam dots. Now you are ready to start layering your card.



Start with the largest element. See the blue circled element above. Next add the shaped piece of the castle (the one I cut the legs off of)

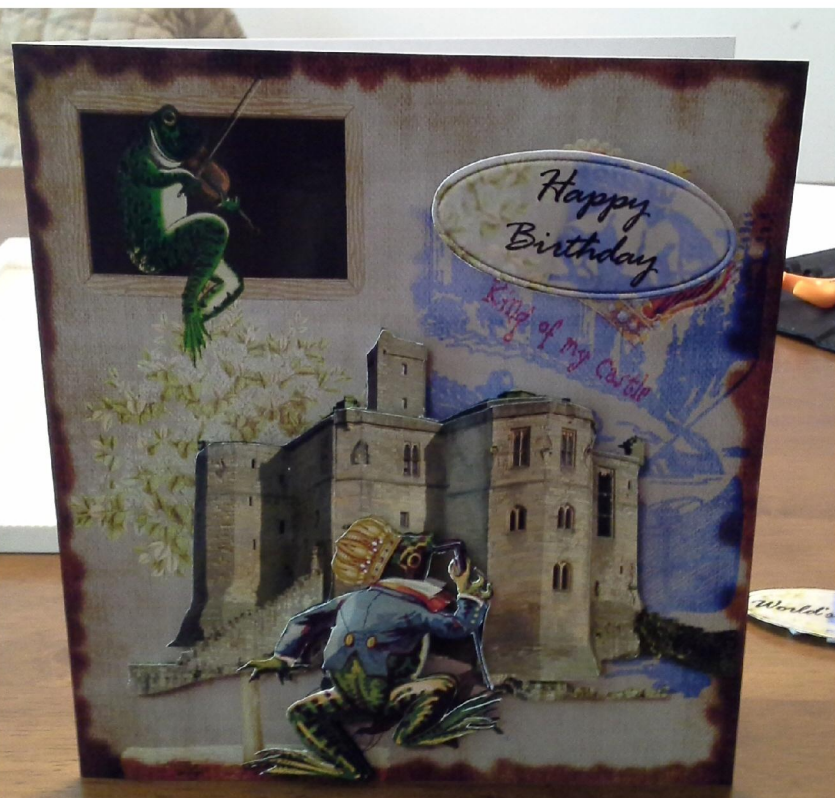


The next step is to add your frog. Place this piece in carefully.



You may have noticed I cut out two sentiment tags. The Happy Birthday tag is for the front, as you can see. Add it where you think it looks best.

The second tag I cut, I will use on the back of my card. I will print the topper sheet cup436695_874, and use it for the insert, and again on the card back. I will add the second tag to the card back



This is my finished card. It is now ready to add my insert and backing. Then it will then be mailed to my brother, who lives in Florida, and has a July birthday!
