## **INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAKING A SPINNER CARD**

To make a spinner card you first need to print out the Craftsuprint sheet onto good quality card. If your printer won't take card, then print onto paper and stick it onto card afterwards.

You also need 2 cocktail sticks and foam pads and glue (silicone is best) and maybe some double sided tape.

You might like to finish off the card with peel offs, gems, brads etc. this is entirely up to you.




Cut out all the pieces on the sheet - the main card, the matching backing shape (rectangle, oval, octagon etc.) and the 2 small strips. On the main image, you need to cut out the centre image and get rid of the white surrounding it. If you look closely you will see a line on either side of the main frame - this might have a letter M beside it.



Find the middle of the main image and stick your cocktail sticks to the back. (See photo).

Leave the cocktail sticks to dry to the glue.



Using double sided tape, stick the two central images back to back. **REMEMBER** to stick one the right way up and the other upside down so that when you flip the image the back will also be the right way up.

Cut out and stick on the decoupage using silicone glue or foam pads. Add any other embellishments - like peel offs, as you wish.



Fold the main frame in half and stick foam pads about half a centimeter down on either side (you are leaving room to insert the cocktail sticks later).

Stick the two sides together using these pads.



Using the 2 small strips, bend up the white ends and stick the back of this little piece onto the inside of the frame, one on the front and one on the back. This will help stop the frame from splaying out. To put the card into the envelope you will need to fold this in half up inside the card so that the card sits flat. (See the photo).

Once the glue has dried on the cocktail sticks, insert one into one side of this frame. Trim off the end so it does not stick out of the frame.

Insert the other cocktail stick into the other side of the card. If you wish you can leave a small end sticking out of the card in order to turn the centre panel but this is not compulsory and you can turn this panel by hand. If you decide to leave an end sticking out make sure you trim off the pointed end for safety's sake. Your finished card should look like this:
