

Swinging Box Stationery Set Tutorial

Print Box pages, 3-D elements & Notecards on good quality cardstock



Print Envelope, Insert & Note paper on at least 90gsm paper

Cut out all elements and score where indicated. Fold as follows:



Note Card, Envelope & Box Front all folds are Mountain Folds.



Card Insert & Box Back are all Valley folds.



Box Insert, inner folds are Valley folds, outer folds are Mountain folds. If you wish to make the Box Insert a bit more sturdy, print a second copy and cut off all of the outer folds and tabs. Mountain fold the remaining folds.



Starting with Box Back, fold sides over, towards printed design, making sure to glue tab inside corner. Glue all edges down.



Glue side of Box Front to side of Box Back, gluing the tab on the inside of the box.



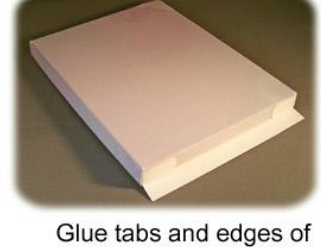
Now glue Box Top bottom to bottom of Box Bottom (this time you do NOT glue the tab - this is the "hinge" for the Box Insert)



Outer folds on Box Front are glued to the back of Box Back.



If you are using the second Box Insert, you glue this to the back of the main insert.



Glue tabs and edges of Box Insert - EXCEPT the outer fold of the bottom edge of the insert.

With backs facing you, glue remaining tab from 1st half of box to the bottom corner of the Box Insert. Now glue the last fold of the Box Insert, anchoring the tab hinge.



Box Insert should now be hinged to Box Front/Back and be able to close inside.



Small magnet clasps may be used to help hold box closed.



Add 3-D elements to Box Front. These add stability to the box front. Box is now complete.



Add inserts to Note Cards. Glue Envelope back over tabs.



You can combine 2 parts white glue with 1 part cedar vinegar for a really great envelope glue instead of using up your DSST.

Box easily holds 10 Note Cards, 10 sheets of Notepaper, & 10 Envelopes.
