

# 3D Window Cards - Page 1

Fabulous keepsake cards that are simple to make but look so stunning when made up and will WOW the recipient.



For best results print sheets 1 to 4 onto photo paper or good quality cardstock



## 3D Window Cards - Page 2



Before cutting out use a ruler and scoring tool and using the registration marks score along the lines on sheets 1, 2 and 3

there are:-

- 1 on sheet 1 (front)
- 4 on sheet 2 (back outer)
- 3 on sheet 3 (back inner)



Cut out the sheets.  
Apply glue to the reverse of sheet 3 (back inner)



Align with sheet 2 (back inner) and stick back to back. There will be a narrow strip at the base left white, this is the flap to join the card together.



Keeping the sheets the same way up as in the last step fold over on the central scored line and using a bone folder



## 3D Window Cards - Page 3



Fold down and crease along the next score line



Fold up and crease along the next score line (the white flap)



Turn over, fold and crease along the top score line



Your card will now look like this.

You can now add any extras onto the inner back of your card



## 3D Window Cards - Page 4



Cut out the front including the windows.



Turn over. Fold up and crease along the score line



Apply Glue to the top (arched) side of the score line



Line up and stick to the front of the back pieces you worked on earlier so the design on the inside of the card shows through the windows.



## 3D Window Cards - Page 5



Fold and crease the front upwards

If you didn't add any extras earlier you could do so now



Apply glue to the bottom flap on the back



Fold the front down and aligning the bottom edges stick into place

Your card will now stand up:-
