These Panel Pyramage 6in x 6in Card Front designs are quick and easy to make, and folds flat for posting. There are 2 sheets that can be purchased separately which is a sheet for the Panel Pyramage and a sheet for the matching 6in x 6in Insert (the insert sheet is optional, for that really professional finishing touch) In this tutorial I have included a few tips for those of you who are new to card making, to make your cards aesthetically pleasing to the eye.

Finished Sizes:

Pyramage Topper	Sheet is sized to fit on a 6 inch x 6 inch Card Blank, but there is no reason why you couldn't use any size of card blank, that is larger than 6 inch x 6 inch, and of course, the option is always there to change your printer settings, to print whatever size you wish, within the size parameters of your printer. (See instructions for you own printer) Length 5 5/8in (14.1 cm) Width 5 5/8in (14.1 cm)
Insert	Sheet is sized to fit into a 6in x 6in Card Blank but of course, you can also change your printer settings, to print whatever size you require within the size parameters of your printer. (See instructions for you own printer)

If your finished sizes are larger than the measurements above, the most likely cause, will be that you are printing to media size (e.g. A4 size or Letter Size), rather than printing at actual size. Please see the notes at the end of this document where I explain how you get your printer to print at actual size. N.B. You don't have to change the settings on the physical Printer, but when you send a document to your printer to print, it's the settings on the options box that appears on your PC screen that need to be set, to correctly print at actual size.




6 inch x 6 inch Card blank	1 ready-made 6 inch x 6i inch card blank from any good craft store) obviously, you could use this design on a larger Card Blank, if preferred
Panel Pyramage Sheet	1 Sheets A4/Letter Size 160gsm Cardstock or 200gsm Photo Paper.
Insert Sheet	1 Sheets A4/Letter Size 120gsm - 160gsm Cardstock
Double-sided tape, Photo Glue or Wet Glue 3d Sticky Foam Pads

# **Cut Out Pyramage Sheet**

- 1 Card Front
- 2 Pyramage Layer 1
- 3 Pyramage Layer 2
- 4 Pyramage Layer 3
- 5 Pyramage Layer 4
- 6 Pyramage Layer 5


7 – 8 Decoupage Layers (this design (on other designs there may be more layers, but full instructions are included on the specific sheet purchased))

Cut out all the pieces above (see Photo 1 left), marking the number of the piece lightly in pencil on the back of the layer, as you cut.

# **Card Front**

I have chosen to mat the card front (see Photo 2 left) on to silver mirror card, to give it a professional finish. If you would like to do the same, and you are making a 6in x 6in card, the silver mirror card must only be 1/16in (1.5mm) greater all round than the size of the Card Front (1) Attach the Card Front with doublesided tape or wet glue

Apply the Card Front (1) on to your card blank (see Photo 3 left), with double-sided tape or wet glue.

#### Pyramage

Apply 3d Foam Pads to the Pyramage layers (2-6) and the Decoupage layers (7-8 this design (on other designs there may be more layers, but full instructions are included on the specific sheet purchased)), If the design you are making has butterflies – they are attached with wet glue rather than 3d foam pads.

Add the Pyramage layers (2-6) in numerical order to the card front. If you are posting the card, you may be able to reduce postage costs, by just applying the alternate layers of Pyramage (2, 4 and 6), or alternatively, use 1mm Foam Pads.

Add the Decoupage layers to the card front, again, in the numerical order specified. For those designs with Butterflies (this design doesn't have any), score and fold each side of the butterfly bodies, bending the wings upwards. Apply a wet glue just to the undersides of the bodies and apply to the card front. (See Photo 2 left)


The finished card is shown in Photo 3 left.




#### Instructions for Insert

#### Insert

Score and fold and burnish along the dotted line. (See Photo 1 left)

Apply double-sided tape or wet glue, to the back of the left hand portion of the folded insert. (See Photo 2 left)

Place the insert fold into the fold of the finished card (see Photo 3 left), and lower the card front over the double sided tape and press from the front of the card, down the spine to attach the insert into the card

Finished Insert inside the card (see Photo 4 left)

So that's it all finished!

A beautiful quick and easy floral card that can be used for any occasion! Lots of other designs are available in this collection, and my other Pyramage collections, some of which are shown below.


#### Printer Settings for CUP sheets

Please note that the measurements / Card Blank sizes in this tutorial are correct sizes, providing you print the sheets with your printer settings set to 'Actual Size', rather than 'Fit to Media', which some of my customers seem to be doing. The effect of printing CUP sheets with the 'Fit to Media' setting, will cause the sheets to print out larger than the design size actually is, and larger than the designer intended, and you will most likely (certainly with my designs!), have to cut into the Card Front design to get it to fit! So if that's happening to you, please see details below of how to correct this problem, which is simple to fix, so that when I say in my instructions that the design tutorials that the design will fit a specific Card Blank size, it will fit, and you won't have to cut into the card front design to gur printer at the time when you send a sheet to your printer to print. Here are the settings that I use on my printer, when sending CUP sheets to my printer. The screen shots below may be different on your printer, in respect of the layout and the terms that are used, and the software that you use to print, but I don't think you should have any problems seeing what the equivalent terms being used on your own printer are.

You don't need to do anything on the actual printer, provided when you print your CUP sheets you go through the Printer dialogue box (Press CTRL & P together, on your keyboard to bring up the Print Box)

This 'Scale' option is checked/ticked, which shows that I print any CUP sheets at their 'Actual Size' i.e.100%

You will see that this 'To Fit A4' option, (i.e. 'Fit to Media') You will see that this 'To Fit A4' option, (i.e. the equivalent to 'Fit

To Media') is not checked / ticked on my settings above. If it was, then because a CUP sheet has a printable area, which is less than A4, the effect of checking / ticking this option will increase the printable area to A4 and the sheet will be printed In a size larger than the designer intended. If it is on yours, (N.B the term used on your printer may be called something different, but it will have the meaning of 'Fit to Media' (i.e. Fit to A4 (or Letter size in the US)), then you may find that you have to cut into the printed design on my card fronts (and other designers card fronts), in order for them to fit on the card blanks that I, and other designers, indicate the size the sheets are designed for. In actual fact, when you print my designs at the correct setting of Actual size, there will ALWAYS be a small margin around my card fronts when you apply them to the card blank size I have instructed, if there isn't, or you have to cut into my card front design to make it fit the card blank, then you are printing as 'Fit To Media' instead of printing to 'Actual Size' which is the correct setting for it to fit on the card blank size, I say it is for. The reason for this, is because on CUP sheets the printable area, we have to design with, is smaller than A4, so that every printer that each customer may have (including international paper

sizes), will easily be able to print the sheets without any clipping occurring. If the printable area at CUP was A4 then there would be problems if the customer had a printer that wasn't able to print borderless A4 prints, and also those international customers who print on paper sizes that are different sizes to A4 (such as Letter Size which is the paper size that is used in the US)

Once you change this setting to 'Actual Size', or the equivalent term used on your printer. I have a Kodak printer, and my printer setting to print to actual size is called 'Scale' and the percentage I have set against it is 100%. I hope that helps...
